1.2 Project Description

The goal of BCH III project is "to provide support to eligible parties for GEF funding to build and sustain individual and institutional capacities for effective participation in the BCH in line with COP/MOP Decisions, specifically BS VI/5 para 2f ". More specifically, the two main objectives are to achieve: 1) Effective participation to the BCH from participating countries, and 2) Stakeholder's inclusiveness.

The project includes the following 4 components:

Component 1: National BCH Institutional Capacity Development including Effective and Inclusive Participation, Production and Sharing of Information

Component 2: National Sustainability of Biosafety Clearing House Mechanisms through the Establishment of Effective National Procedures

Component 3: Regional Networking, Experience and Knowledge Sharing

Component 4: Global Sustainability of BCH and other Multilateral Environmental Agreements' sharing Mechanisms through the Regional Advisors System.

The project executing agency is UNEP-Law Division project team, working in close coordination with National Executing Agencies (often ministries of environment or national biosafety research centers) in participating countries

Summary of status

Outcome 1: Increased number of national workshops, development of e-learning course and finalization of the BCH III communication campaign

Under Outcome 1 on enhanced use and access of BCH data and effective participation in the BCH, 9 out of 13 targets are achieved (100%). During the reporting period, the total number of workshops held since the beginning of the project increased from 125 to 134 in 44 countries. 101% of Target 1.1 achieved in the current reporting period, from 83% during the previous reporting period. The percentage of countries which completed national BCH capacity building activities and developed sustainability plans increased from 33 to 39 (or 87% to 97.3%) of Target 1.2.

The BCH in collabration with CBD have continued to enhance the front-end development needs of the BCH and to ensure that all important features requested by the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol were implemented on the new BCH platform. BCH migrate to its new platform as per COP decisions, (CP-9/2, NP-3/3), the BCH operates on the same platform as the ABSCH. This has resulted in: a) Development of online formats for the 5th National Report on the Implementation of the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety and the 1st National Report on the Implementation of the Nagoya Protocol in all UN languages; b) Migration of the Vue 2 component to Vue 3, which enhanced the capabilities of the BCH and other clearing-houses of the Convention; c) Developed the Laboratories (LAB) Registry page in the BCH as recommended of the Informal Advisory Committee made at its twelfth meeting held in May 2023; d) Export function for record types added allowing users to generate more comprehensive reports, fixed numerous bugs, glitches in both clearing houses, implementation and improvement of specific features of the front-end user interface

of the BCH. The Export function was also developed in the ABSCH, and the Expert function is in the final stage of development for the following record types in the BCH: CNAs, SPCAs, LAWs, DECs, RAs and IRAs, Biosafety Experts, VLR, LAB, LMOs, GENEs, ORGAs, CDIs.

Outcome 1 challenges: Delays in the implementation of national workshops activities and request for a project extension up until 31 December 2024. As of June 2024, out of the 43 countries that have signed SSFAs with the UNEP Law Division to implement national project activities, 37 countries have completed the national workshops and reported accordingly. In this reporting period, 11 participating countries have extended their Small-Scale Funding Agreements (SSFAs) until 30 June 2024. Five (5) countries—Nicaragua, Solomon Islands, Mongolia, Bahamas, and Nicaragua—have finalized their national workshops and are currently working on the final report. The remaining six countries—Tanzania, Grenada, Barbados, Cape Verde, Gabon, and Cameroon—will need to extend their SSFAs until December 2024 to complete project activities in their respective countries. The project extension up to 31 December 2024 requested by BCH III Project Manager has been granted. The objective of this extension is to allow the completion of the project.

Outcome 2: Improved participants knowledge, increased number of countries who concluded their 3rd workshop and have a VLE course, further impact on national frameworks. 8 out of 9 of targets under Outcome 2 on strengthened national BCH systems and procedures' targets have already been achieved (100%).

A total of 41 out of 44 countries which are implementing national level project activities have completed a third national workshop – organized under the lead of the country and with less support from the Regional Advisor, as national counterparts have built knowledge from the first two workshops. The initial target of 38 countries (50% of 76) was set with the assumption that a total of 76 countries will be implementing national project activities. Therefore, this target is met (100%) as 28 countries, more than half of the 44 countries, have organized and delivered the 3rd workshop by themselves.

Outcome 3: 2nd national workshop organized following a regional training of trainer (ToT) and one survey being developed to assess knowledge-sharing after the ToT. 10 out 12 targets under Outcome 3 on enhanced regional networking and knowledge-sharing have already been achieved (100%). To assess skills or knowledge-sharing by participants of these regional ToTs with colleagues (Target 3.5 is 70% completed). The questionaire for the survey has been developed and reviewed, it will be shared to participants in 2024. Under Target 3.3, six regional Training of Trainers (ToT) workshops for NFPs and NAUs in six regions developed and organized, focusing on countries that have not signed SSFAs for national activities. In this reporting period, two Regional BCH Training Workshops were held in Pacific and Central and Eastern Europe regions in November 2023 and January 2024 respectively. Plans are underway for preparing the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for the establishment of BCH centers of excellence. The BCH project has continued to improve the skills and e-knowledge of NFPs in using the Biosafety Clearing-House to submit and search for information and support decision-making on LMOs. NFPs have shared various knowledge, methodologies, and findings related to the environmental and health impacts of LMOs. Preparations to organize a BCH/ABS regional workshop for the African regions in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire are underway. In this reporting milestone, Rwanda Biosafety and Biosaccurity Organization (www.rbbo.org) plan to organize a workshop and training on the Biosafety Clearing House in 2024 as the result of BCH activities in the country. Preparations to organize a BCH/ABS regional workshop for the African regions (Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire) are underway.

Outcome 4: Organization of the global Training of Trainers (ToT) and certification of the Regional Advisors

10 out of 13 targets under Outcome 4 on strengthened and institutionalized BCH regional advisory system had already been achieved (100%). Under Target 4.3 - 5 RAs deliver global workshops at CBD COPs 100% accomplishment was already reported in the previous reporting period. Plans for COP16 which will be held in November 2024 in Cali - Colombia will brings stakeholders from different countries to enhance global and sub-regional networking and knowledge sharing of information parties' obligations, on searching and submitting of information on the BCH and its relevance to the Cartagena Protocol for effective implementation of the Biosafety Clearing House (BCH).

Environmental and social safeguards under this project focus on generating information pathways for parties to gather and update mandatory baseline information and tools on risk assessment, risk management, monitoring and enforcement tools to support decision making systems and build in measures to ensure safeguards. To support such actions, the project has developed trainer of trainers' materials, webinars and video guides on information inputs and access of safeguards information on the BCH.

2.8. KM/Learning

Knowledge activities and products

Countries interest in new training materials (confirmed with BCH Training Needs Assessment in July 2020), resulted in the development of new training material specific to the new BCH III virtual workshop setting and to the launch of the new BCH platform (https://bch.cbd.int/en/)by the Secretariat of the CBD. These new training materials are available on UNEP servers, that hosts a revamp and modernized Virtual Learning Environment (VLE).

During this reporting period, the training materials were updated, new ones prepared, and missing ones inserted on the VLE to include all protocol articles related to the BCH as well as to new relevant COP-MOP decisions with information-sharing requirements. Training manuals were updated ensuring that they reflected the new revamped version of the Biosafety Clearing House platform and are aligned with the project's objectives. The updated training materials included: a) Stakeholder curricula: e.g. National Data Entry (CC01), NGOs and Civil Society (CC03), Industry Group (CC04), Scientists, Academics, Biosafety Organizations (CC05), Customs and border control (CC06) etc. New categories of training materials e.g. videos/webinars and banners were updated and included in the new version for ease identification. b) Training manuals: An Introduction to CPB (MO01), Introduction to BCH (MO02), Surfing the BCH Central Portal" (MO03), Registering Information in the BCH Central Portal (MO06), Information-sharing Obligations on Becoming a Party to the Protocol (MO10) etc. (Reference:- https://bch3-vle.unep.org/).

Main learning during the period

It is extremely important that the Parties continue to use the training materials developed and made available on the virtually learning platform for continuous learning and feedback to enrich understanding and obligations on the BCH and Information Shairng under Article 31

It is crucial to continuously engage National Focal Points (NFPs) and other stakeholders to enhance their skills and e-knowledge in using the updated Biosafety Clearing-House online platform. During this period, the NFPs and National Authorised Users (NAUs) benefited from two regional Training of Trainers workshops that took place in Pacific and Central and Eastern Europe regions. They were able to share knowledge, experiences and lessons learned from differrent countries.
