B. Enabling Activity Summary

Enabling Activity Objective

The objective of this enabling activity will be to enable the Sultanate of Oman to develop and strengthen its capacity to undertake and prepare national climate change reports, specifically the First Biennial Transparency Report and the Third National Communication, in compliance with its reporting commitments as a Party to the United Nations Framework Convention of Climate Change (UNFCCC) and its Paris Agreement. It will build on and learn from previous work and institutional arrangements undertaken in relation to the first and second national communications and its first Biennial Update Report under the UNFCCC. Efforts will be made to address the needs for climate change reporting capacity building identified in the technical review of the initial BUR of Oman. Specifically, it will: (a) Enhance understanding and capacity to meet NC and BTR reporting requirements; (b) Improve the national GHG inventory by estimating emissions of precursor and indirect gases, as well as short-lived climate pollutants; (c) Improve the information provided on mitigation actions and their effects by: (i) Reporting on methodologies and assumptions; (ii) Developing an MRV system for its NDC that encompasses, inter alia, approach to monitoring progress in implementing actions, reaching targets and achieving emission reductions; (iii) Developing and implementing NAMAs and other actions under its NDC; and (d) Develop indicators for adaptation and climate modeling at a fine scale.

Enabling Activity Summary

Oman is one of the developing countries in West Asia that is particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change[1]¹. Among the climate change impacts are increased temperature, evaporation, sea level, and rainfall variability. Rising temperatures and decreasing precipitation would exacerbate the water shortage of the country, while warmer temperatures with higher climate variability would also increase the risk of floods and droughts. Climate change will have tremendous consequences on fisheries and marine ecosystems in Oman as the rapid warming of the Arabian sea would likely lead to more destructive tropical cyclones hitting the coastline of Oman[2]². The Sultanate of Oman, which operates on hydrocarbon resources, has generated around two-thirds to three-quarters of its yearly government revenue over the last three decades. The Oil and Gas Industry remains the primary source of GHG emissions in the country

To respond to this context, the country has embarked on several ambitious initiatives. Over 2015-2020, the Sultanate of Oman developed its National Strategy for Adaptation and Mitigation to Climate Change 2020-2040 to accelerate the pace and scale of climate actions. Furthermore, in November 2022, the country announced its plan to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050[3]³. Since becoming a Party to the Convention in 1992, it has carried out many projects related to climate mitigation and adaptation, including:

- The Initial National Communication (INC) of Oman, with funding from GEF and UNDP, with UNEP/ROWA as the Implementing Agency and Sultan Qaboos University as the executive entity;
- The Second National Communication (NC2) of Oman and the First Biennial Update Report (BUR1) were funded by GEF, with the UNEP/ROWA as the Implementing Agency and Sultan Qaboos University as the executive entity;
- According to decision 2/CP.17, paragraph 41(a), the first BUR of Oman was technically assessed by a team of international experts, and they submitted their report on October 23, 2020, to UNFCCC. The



technical review provided conclusions on the transparency of Oman's information on GHG inventory emissions and the deterrent impact of the envisaged mitigation actions.

- The Green Climate Fund (GCF) approved the first Readiness and Preparatory Support Programme for developing the Country program and the engagement Plan of the Sultanate of Oman with GCF on April 24, 2017, with Sultan Qaboos University as a Delivery Partner.
- The CF approved the second Readiness and Preparatory Support Programme on <u>Building resilient</u> <u>Environment and Sustainable Agriculture and Water</u> on June 4, 2021, with Food Agriculture Organization (FAO) as a Delivery Partner.
- The GCF approved the third Readiness and Preparatory Support Programme on Low-Carbon Transportation Development in the Sultanate of Oman on July 7, 2021, with UNIDO as Delivery Partner.
- The GCF approved the National Adaptation Plan (NAP) proposal on December 23, 2022, with UNIDO as Delivery Partner. The NAP's objective is to integrate adaptation into development planning in Oman, resulting in low carbon, climate-resilient development priorities, projects, and transition pathways.

These projects have significantly contributed to the fulfillment of national commitments to the Convention and are expected to deliver tangible outcomes in the coming years, on which the country will be reporting. Through this enabling activity, the country will be better equipped to report on such outcomes, and will also have a better understanding of the forthcoming challenges facing climate change adaptation and mitigation. In short, the project will meet the main objective by conducting GHG emission inventories for the most relevant sectors, monitoring the implementation of priority interventions, updating platforms, studies and reports, conducting necessary assessments, engaging key stakeholders, and finally preparing reports and submitting them to the Convention. During project implementation, resources will be deployed to build the capacities of national experts as they participate in the preparation of key documents and learn about reporting procedures and modalities under the climate change framework and the Convention. This will help to bridge the national knowledge gap in this area and facilitate the preparation of future reports. The total duration of the project will be 12 months and will be possible thanks to the participation of international and national experts as well as the engagements of key national stakeholders as described in section 2D.

SECTION 2: ENABLING ACTIVITY SUPPORTING INFORMATION

C. Eligibility Criteria

Please provide eligibility information for this enabling activity.

The Sultanate of Oman ratified the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change on February 8, 1992, and the Kyoto Protocol on January 19, 2005. Oman also signed the Paris Agreement on April 22, 2016, and ratified it on April 24, 2019. Oman is a Party to several other UN conventions, including biological diversity, ozone-depleting substances, and combating desertification. Based on 1/CP.21 and 1/CMA.2 decisions, the Sultanate of Oman submitted its Second Nationally Determined Contribution (SNDC) report to UNFCCC in July 2021.

The project's primary goal is to assist the Sultanate of Oman in developing its Third National Communication (NC3) and First Biennial Transparency Report (BTR1) in accordance with Decision 17/CP.8's guidelines for the development of national communications by non-Annex 1 Parties, with Article 13 of the Paris Agreement on the enhanced transparency framework for action and support, and the modalities, procedures, and guidelines for the enhanced transparency framework under the Paris Agreement under decision 18/CMA.1. The project will ultimately assist the Sultanate of Oman in submitting a combined BTR/NC to the UNFCCC by December 2025. The NC3/BTR1 project proposal is in accordance with GEF's Information Note on the Financing of Biennial Transparency Reports for Developing Country Parties to the Paris Agreement (GEF/C.59/Inf.19, 23 November 2020).

Gender analysis and data on climate impacts and socially differentiated vulnerabilities, roles and responsibilities to inform national initiatives are currently lacking in Oman. While it is recognized that women and men play diverse roles in society, culture and the economy, there is limited research and knowledge on how women and men experience the impacts of climate change differently. The enabling activity will seek to fill these gaps wherever possible and contribute to the integration of gender equality issues into climate change efforts, including parallel projects such as the GEF readiness proposal '*Enhancing the National Adaptation Plan Process in the Sultanate of Oman*', also in collaboration with UNIDO.

D. Institutional Framework

Describe the institutional arrangements for implementation of the enabling activity.

Under the project 'Oman: Preparation of the First Biennial Transparency Report and the Third National Communication under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change', the United Nations Industrial Development (UNIDO) will serve as the GEF implementing agency. UNIDO will provide the Environment Authority (EA) with all necessary support in the areas of project management, monitoring and evaluation during the implementation of the joint BTR1/ NC3 project. UNIDO will report on the project's performance to the GEF. The project will be executed by the EA and UNIDO. As a governmental entity, EA will be primarily responsible for planning and managing the project activities, accounting, reporting and monitoring. Workshops, consultations and trainings will be fully conducted by the Environment Authority. To facilitate the engagement of national and international experts, EA has requested UNIDO to assist the Government in the related recruitment processes, as well as in travel arrangements, taking into account the efficiency that this approach would represent for the project vis-à-vis national execution. The Project Steering Committee (PSC) will oversee the overall coordination and implementation of the BTR and NC3 projects, provides strategic guidance to the project, advises the project team in resolving strategic level issues and risks, provides the political level coordination or facilitation to the project and assesses the project progress and make



necessary recommendations on the project outputs and outcomes to the project team. The Project Steering Committee will comprise a Chairperson, a Deputy Chairperson, and three members. The Chairman of the Environment Authority shall be the Chairperson of the Project Steering Committee. At the same time, the National Climate Change Committee will provide general policy and cross-sectoral guidance. EA will appoint the Principal Investigator, and the National Director and a Project Coordinator. Four task forces will be formed as follows:


- •Task Force on National Circumstances and National Inventory Report (NIR),
- •Task Force on NDC tracking and progress,
- •Task Force on Impacts, Vulnerability, and Adaptation,

•Task Force on Financial, Technology Development and Transfer and Capacity-Building (FTTCB), Research and Systematic Observation (RSO), Education, Training and Public Awareness (ETPA), and other Information.

Sub-working groups (Technical Expert Groups, TEGs) will be established within Task Forces (TF), as shown in Figure 1. The TFs and TEGs will be led mainly by members of the Environment Authority, and the nature of the activity and mandates of the government entities determine the composition of the task forces. Each TEG will include a minimum of three members: a team leader, a subject expert, and a practitioner from the corresponding government agency that reflects the study's policy dimension. All of the essential ministries in the Sultanate of Oman will have a hand in the Project, including the Ministries of Agriculture, Fisheries and Water Resources, Housing and Urban Planning, Energy and Minerals, and Economy, to name a few. The private sector and civil society organizations of the country will be consulted as needed to give information and input on the project's design and implementation of national laws and policies. Engaging with the appropriate technical project teams tasked with gathering data and information and preparing reports and chapters for the combined NC3/BTR1 is another possible avenue of participation, with the goals of providing and validating information and providing stakeholder feedback on the draft reports and chapters.

To the extent possible, efforts will be made to promote equal participation of women in training activities and workshops. Stakeholders promoting gender equality and women's empowerment (GEEW) issues, such as gender focal points, and associations that foster GEEW will be prioritized during consultation processes. When data collection or assessments are conducted, gender dimensions will be considered and collection of sex-disaggregated data will be pursued.





E. Monitoring and Evaluation Plan

Describe the budgeted M&E plan.

The project will be monitored through the following M&E activities (Table 1):

A Project Inception Workshop (PIW) will be held within the first two months of the start of the project. The PIW will be attended by all relevant stakeholders, including those with assigned roles in the project organization structure. The Inception Workshop is crucial to building ownership of the project results and reviewing and agreeing on the first-year annual work plan. The Inception Workshop report is a key reference document and must be prepared and shared with participants to formalize various agreements and plans decided during the meeting. The Workshop report will be compiled two weeks following the Project Inception Workshop.

Monitoring BTR1/NC3 Technical progress against expenditures: The Project Coordinator will prepare quarterly progress reports and expenditure statements. UNIDO Task Manager and Fund Management Officer shall review technical progress and financial reports.



Project Annual and final financial audit will be undertaken to assess the probity (i.e. correctness, integrity etc.) of expenditures and transactions.

Annual Inventory of Non-expendable equipment: The Executing Agency shall maintain complete and accurate records of non-expendable equipment purchased with GEF project funds and shall provide UNIDO annually with the inventory of such non-expendable equipment as of December 31, to be submitted within two months.

Periodic Monitoring through discussions with key partners: UNIDO Task Manager will conduct periodic monitoring activities based on the agreed schedule in the project's Inception Report/Annual Work Plan to assess the project implementation status. Monitoring project activities will identify areas of improvement and will make recommendations on how to address gaps in project implementation.

During the last three months, the project team will prepare the Project Terminal Report. This comprehensive report will summarize the results (objectives, outcomes, outputs), lessons learned, problems met, and areas where results may not have been achieved. It will also set out some recommendations necessary to ensure the sustainability and replicability of the project's results.

Monitoring and evaluation efforts will take gender mainstreaming into account at all stages and will seek to integrate sex-disaggregated data to ensure that both women and men are included in the process and reflected in project results and reports.
