The supplies budgeted under technical outcomes are intended to cover the cost of supplies and stationery for technical work, trainings, workshops, and webinars. They are not related to the PMC activities.

The UNDP?s account code structure does not accommodate Stationery expenses under ?Training, Workshops and Confer? budget category. To accommodate the expenses, the amounts, which were previously allocated under Supplies, are charged under ?Other Operating

Costs? expenditure category in the GEF Budget table, which can correspond to related Audio Visual & Print Production Costs in the UNDP account code structure.

- 1. The supplies budgeted under technical outcomes are intended to support the provision of services for hosting technical workshops and webinars. They are not related to the PMC activities or related purchases kindly refer to the budget note.
- 2. The project will be executed under Country Office Support to NIM modality as communicated with and approved by the GEF Secretariat. A footnote explanation is added under GEF budget table (in the Portal) to clarify that UNDP will be the entity to process all payments and provide the execution support services to the project based on the request of the Ministry of Environment and Renewable Energies. The Ministry of Environment and Renewable Energies as the Executing Entity (Implementing Partner in UNDP terminology) will maintain ultimate responsibility and accountability for the use of GEF resources and the successful achievement of project outputs, in alignment with the approved annual work plans.
