The focus on EbA, going beyond general natural resource management, as a climate change adaptation measure, and compliance with regulations, have been added to the project design to ensure that the benefits of all EbA interventions are maximised by strengthening the integrity of ecosystems and thereby providing services to vulnerable target communities and increase their resilience to climate change. This has now been additionally clarified in a footnote in the CEO endorsement letter (p.2) and detail added in the output description in the project document (p.65).

Since the co-financing strategy has been carefully tailored to align with the development of the SCFF and the other project activities where government and district offices will be directly responsible for project implementation, the higher proportion of investment mobilized will not significantly increase the number of direct beneficiaries beyond what has been estimated. Instead, the co-financing strategy has been developed to ensure project sustainability and future replication from piloting the SCCF, which means that there indeed be a larger number of beneficiaries in the long term as the SCCF is transferred from this single project to the National Climate Change Fund. This increase, however, might not be measurable during project implementation period. UNDP co-finance will translate into increase in number of beneficiaries, but not measurable during project lifetime, as it is geared to ensure scalability beyond the project, as part of the project exist strategy. Having said that however, an increase in reach and number of beneficiaries may likely to take place during the project duration, but such claims cannot be made at this point. This will be closely monitored and reported during the implementation.

CEO Recommendation

Brief reasoning for CEO Recommendations

The LDCF funded ?Transformational Adaptation for Climate Resilience in Lake Chilwa Basin of Malawi (TRANSFORM)? project aims to reduce the vulnerability of communities surrounding Lake Chilwa to the adverse effects of climate change by strengthening the resilience of livelihoods through Ecosystem-based Adaptation (EbA) and financing of climate-resilient enterprises. The LDCF will provide a financing of \$5 million for the project and will mobilize \$21.45 million of co-financing from Malawi Government and UNDP. It will benefit 80,000 people directly with 61% of the beneficiaries being women. It will also bring 121,000 hectares of land under climate resilient management and strengthen capacity of 5000 people for better adaptation planning.

The project will achieve this through three integrated components. Under the first component, GEF resources will be used to establish an innovative financial mechanism? namely the Sustainable Climate Financing Facility (SCFF)? which will stimulate public and private sector investment for MSMEs and strengthen the micro-finance for innovation in climate-resilient livelihoods, enterprises, and technologies. To operationalize the fund the project will provide technical assistance to the Malawi National Climate Change Fund (NCCF) to integrate and implement the SCFF initially introduced through the UNDP Growth Accelerator. The fund will be also complemented by supporting creation of a market innovation hub which will bring multiple stakeholders and market players in one platform to facilitate access to adaptation technologies and services.

In the second component, the project will develop an ecosystem based adaptation (EbA) plan for the Lake Chilwa Basin which will factor in climate risks in the region and will be complemented by a community-based monitoring and reporting system to support improved natural resource management in compliance with environmental regulations. Within this component, the project will support implementation of adaptation solutions such as ecotourism in the Lake Chilwa basin, upscaling alternate livelihoods such as mushroom cultivation and products derived from beekeeping enterprises; and development of fishery and agricultural value chains. The implementation support will follow a structured phase wise process of baseline information collection on resource availability and climate vulnerability; finalizing ecosystem management plans and legal agreements between communities and governments; and finally empowering communities and other stakeholders to implement the plans. The project will identify climate-resilient livelihoods that align with the EbA action plans using Community-Based Resilience Analysis (CoBRA) adaptation planning tool. The adaptation solutions under this component will be linked to the SCFF Framework Investment Plan (FIP), which will be developed for each target district.

Under the third component, TRANSFORM will capacitate district- and community-level institutions to plan, implement and monitor Ecosystem-based Adaptation (EbA)? particularly to qualify for funding from the SCFF. TRANSFORM will complement other projects and initiatives in the basin through a focus on information and knowledge management?

including the establishment of a knowledge management hub, which will serve as a repository for information generated in the basin. This will improve access to knowledge and information on: i) climate resilient natural resources management; ii) best practices on the implementation of diversified livelihoods and ecosystems-based adaptation (EbA) interventions; and iii) market information? collected in the information hub developed under Component 1.

The TRANSFORM project will complement the LDCF funded AfDB project in the Lake Chilwa Basin of Malawi which focuses on strengthening capacity of Beach Village Committees in the basin for adaptation planning and making fisheries sector climate resilient. The project implementation structure has made clear provisions to ensure effective collaboration between the two projects in Malawi for deriving maximum value for LDCF.

Overall, the project adopts an innovative and integrated approach to address critical adaptation barriers in the country including limited access to climate finance, lack of community led adaptation planning and low private sector engagement in adaptation. The project will strengthen institutional capacity at national and local levels (local EbA planning), enhance resilience of agriculture value chain, implement nature-based solutions such as catchment and wetland restoration and support climate-resilient livelihoods that reduce land degradation and contribute to the strengthening of ecosystems. The strategic support to the national climate change fund and establishment of a new fund dedicated to support adaptation projects by the private sector and strengthen micro finance sector in the country can have scalable impact beyond the project's target region.
