2. There is a typo in the sentence after Table 1, i.e., it should be GEF ID 8024 instead of GEF ID 80024 (there is an extra zero):

?It should also be noted that three of the countries have accessed GEF support for the preparation of their initial NDCs: Dominica, Mozambique, and Turkmenistan accessed support through an umbrella project (GEF ID # 80024)?.

- 3. In Table 1, it is stated that the BUR1 of St. Vincent and the Grenadines will be canceled. However, it is not clear whether only the BUR1 of this country will be canceled or the entire umbrella program GEF ID 10167 will be canceled since the latter includes the former. Please clarify this issue.
- 4. Pursuant to paragraph 11 of Article 7 of the Paris Agreement, please indicate for each participating country whether the Adaptation Communication will be submitted in conjunction with the proposed BTR1 or BTR/NC, with other reports, or as a standalone document.
- 5. Regarding coordination with other existing climate change projects, aside from Azerbaijan, Turkmenistan has an approved CBIT PIF (GEF ID 11070) with FAO.

Please reflect this in the project document and ensure there is coordination and collaboration between both projects.

- 6. Gender considerations shall be mainstreamed on the three outputs of the project and not just a separate section on ?Gender? on the CEO Approval document. Please adjust the outputs accordingly.
- 7. Please reflect on what's in the "Gender" section in the Gender Action Plans to be developed and ensure that gender-related results are included in the project's Monitoring and Evaluation activities.

- 6. The two main project outputs have been updated to consider gender mainstreaming as follows:
- 1.1.1 Six (6) BTR1s are prepared through gendersensitive processes for participating countries to submit to the UNFCCC using top-up financing.
- 1.1.2 Two (2) BTR1/NC3s are prepared through gender-sensitive processes for participating countries to submit to the UNFCCC using top-up financing.

The above changes have been incorporated on page 4, 5, 10 & 26.

1. Table 1 on Qatar?s NC preparation status has been updated to ?NC2 under preparation?.

- 2. Umbrella project ?(GEF ID # 80024)? has been replaced with ?(GEF ID # 8024)? on pg. 9 for countries that have accessed GEF support for the preparation of their initial NDCs.
- 3. Only the Saint Vincent and the Grenadines? BUR1 project will be cancelled, and not the entire Umbrella (GEF ID 10167), since the other 17 projects under this umbrella are active. This clarification has been provided on pg.9.
- 4. On whether the Adaptation Communication will be submitted in conjunction with the proposed BTR1 or BTR/NC, with other reports, or as a standalone document. UNEP will gather this information from country teams on how they would ?package? their ADCOM report for submission during the annual project status surveys to the GEF. At this point, after GEF approval, country teams would have had a better understanding of the scope and potential overlaps of Adaptation information in the BTRs and ADCOM. Text has been included in Pg. 7 & 8.

UNEP recognizes that many countries are working on different official reporting documents that may be vehicles for submitting an ADCOM under the MPGs of the Paris Agreement and will work closely with the teams to better understand their ADCOM submission plans as the projects progress. This will also be included in annual project status surveys to the GEF. A text on this has been included in the CEO Approval document under Section II.C, pg7/8.

- 6. Information on gender mainstreaming in project activities and implementation has been added to project outputs on pg. 10, 27 & 32.

This execution arrangement builds on the existing NC/BUR project being executed through UNDP. UNDP Turkmenistan will manage the funds, and recruit technical experts, whereas technical and national policy-level decision making processes are led by the State Committee on Environment Protection and Land resources of Turkmenistan. The BTR top-up will therefore be fully integrated into the ongoing NC/BUR administrative processes under UNDP, as a means to maximize its value of complementarity and cost-effectiveness, in this way ensuring a speedy delivery of the BTR to respond to COP requests.
- 2. Clarification on the Project executing arrangements for Qatar has been provided on pg. 36 under the Section on Institutional Framework. This execution arrangement builds on the existing NC/BUR project being executed through UNEP/ROWA. The state of Qatar, through its Ministry of Municipality and Environment appointed UNEP Regional Office of West Asia (UNEP ROWA) to undertake the overall financial management of the project, recruit national teams to deliver on project outputs that meet the COP/UNFCCC reporting guidelines, while the Ministry oversees the technical and national policy-level decision making processes critical for ensuring national endorsement and approval.

A clear distinction has been made for budgets supported by PMC, Monitoring and Evaluation, and project activities. Updated budget has been uploaded with this re-submission.

The participating countries are aware that Terms of Reference describing unique outputs linked to the respective components are required, and there is a distinction in the budget between time spent on project activities and project management. In the one instance where the Project Technical Coordinator is expected to undertake project activities (i.e. for Saint Vincent and the Grenadines), the proposed ToRs have been shared with and screened by UNEP, and the funding allocation under the budget class ?Contractual Services ? Individual" is clearly divided in the Annex 2 budget between project activities and project management. The ToRs for the National Project Technical Coordinator in this case are submitted with this re-submission.
