STAP welcomes this excellent proposal for the use of the Ecosystem Approach to Fisheries.

STAP appreciates the clear and detailed description of the baseline situation and the barriers to achieving sustainable fisheries and biodiversity conservation, and current initiatives to address these.

The incremental reasoning provided in support of the request for GEF investment is clear and logical. STAP welcomes the well-referenced and well-documented basis on which this PIF has been prepared.

The use of the Ecosystem Approach to Fisheries responds to the principles of the CBD and to Aichi targets, and will provide a sound basis on which to develop experience in mainstreaming biodiversity conservation into seascapes and the fisheries sector. The project will have wide value as a test of such approaches. The existence of strong institutional and individual capacity for the project implementation is encouraging, as is the commitment at government and private sector levels.
