Do all target species reside outside the network of National Protected Areas? Do not these PAs require additional resources for effective management and protection of the frog species?</p> <p>Are activities under output 1.1, like cryopreservation, Ex-situ "conservation strategies"? The project would benefit from beefing-up that part (see also comment under baseline). It is also necessary to elaborate on the existing policy, legal and regulatory framework on which the work with Queen's University in Belfast will be standing. This is important to avoid liabilities of the parties involved, including UNDP and the GEF.
