#### **Summary**

The objective of the project is to support the conservation, management, cultivation and sustainable use of medicinal and herbal plants in Jordan. The project would help to: (a) develop a national database on indigenous medicinal and herbal plants to provide information on their status in various ecosystem types, trends in the use of medicinal plants, etc.;

(b) build institutional capacity to conserve medicinal and herbal plants; and

(c) in-situ conservation of medicinal plants.

Expected Project Outputs: The project is expected to result in:

(a) the availability of up to date information on medicinal and herbal

plants to guide policymaking and conservation activities;

(b) creation of an appropriate institutional framework to support conservation and sustainable use of medicinal and herbal plants; and

(c) Improved support for in-situ conservation activities.
