
While confirming UNDP-Pakistan's commitment of US \$ 1.5 million, I would also like to confirm that we have received interest from some of the private sector organisations to support the project. With reference to the General Arrangement concluded 25 September 2000 between the Netherlands Minister for Development Co-operation (the Minister) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP);

Whereas the Minister has decided to support for an amount of USD 4,034,000 the "Protection and Management of Pakistan Wetlands Project" (PWP), with the UNDP project number PIMS 1056 as described in the relevant UNDP Project Document dated 3 November 2004;

Whereas this project has been given the Minister's title "ISL UNDP Wetlands" and activity-number 10379 and will be managed by the Royal Netherlands Embassy Islamabad; and

Whereas UNDP is prepared to accept the support under the conditions of the General Arrangement;

The Minister and UNDP have decided as follows:

The support will be provided for the period from 01 December 2004 to 30 November 2011.

The terms of the General Arrangement will apply to this Arrangement. In addition, the following will apply:

- 1. The Minister will deposit the contribution into the agreed Account in accordance with the following payment schedule:
- 1.1 The first payment of USD 644,500.= will be made upon receipt of the signed Arrangement;
- 1.2 Any subsequent payments will be made every 6 months on the basis of a payment request (including an expenditure forecast).
- 2. UNDP-Pakistan shall submit every six months a narrative and financial report on the preceding half calendar year (01 January till 30 June and 01 July till 31 December) before 31 August and 28 February of each year. Only the first progress report shall cover the period from 01 December 2004 till 30 June 2005.

3. UNDP will deduct a maximum of 5% of the RNE contribution towards its General Management Support (GMS) fee for the project.

- 4. In the calendar year (01 January to 31 December) in which the activity starts, the activity plan, budget and liquidity forecast submitted with the above-mentioned Plan of Operation shall form the basis for the activities to be carried out by UNDP-P. In each subsequent calendar year, the UNDP-P shall submit the annual plan, budget and liquidity forecast to the Minister before 01 December of the year. preceding the calendar year to which they refer.
- 5. The activity will be implemented as described in the Project Document "Protection and Management of Pakistan Wetlands Project" (Appendix I) and the Detailed Project Budget as presented vide letter no PAK/99/G42 dated 3 November 2004 (Appendix II).

This is a follow-up to the very useful meeting between PPAF, WWF and UNDP on 15 April 2004 to discuss possible PPAF collaboration in the proposed GEF/UNDP Pakistan Wetlands Project in which WWF Pakistan is expected to be the Implementing Agency.

As mentioned in the agreement signed between our two organizations for collaboration in the Soan Valley (part of the Salt Range Wetlands Complex), PPAF fully supports the objectives of the Pakistan Wetlands Project. In this Region, we have arranged to undertake community support initiatives through one of our partner-organizations, namely Soon-Valley Development Program.

In financial terms PPAF expects to channel about US \$ 750,000 for sustainable development of community infrastructure in the Soan Valley.
