2. Country eligibility: The Cameroon ratified the Biodiversity Convention on October 19, 1994.

3. Program eligibility: The proposed activity consists in organizing a regional meeting to facilitate the proposed project.

4. Region and Country priority: The Congo Basin includes the second most important rain forest in the World after the Amazon forest. Its current shrinkage (about 0.6 % per year) under increasing human pressure is of major national and global concern. However, monitoring and planning actions in the Basin is very difficult because basic geo-referenced information on the forest area, composition and current status is lacking at the local, national and regional levels. This is a major concern to government's in the region and has been highlighted in several NEAPs. Within the Region, Cameroon is probably one of the most motivated and well equipped countries to lead the Regional Project, and has requested the PDF to assist that process.

5. Nature and scope of expected project: The main objectives of the project are to establish a demand-driven and action-oriented information system and to build up national capacity for monitoring, land use planning, priority setting and decision making on forest and biodiversity management in the Basin at the local, national and regional levels. The project scope is more fully described in the PID dated 6-20-95.

6. Linkage of the REIMP to IA program: The REIMP will provide an information framework for the GEF and other donor biodiversity operations in the Congo Basin. The REIMP will also be related to the World Bank EIS (Environmental Information System) program in Sub-Saharan Africa. Several members of the EIS committee will attend the proposed seminar. François Falloux, advisor of the EIS committee will participate to the preparatory team.

Proposal for PDF Block A Grant of 25,000 US\$**Cameroon****Part II Information on Grant Activities**

1. Summary of project objectives and description. The main objective of the project is to establish a demand-driven and action-oriented environmental information system and also to build capacity at local, national and regional levels to improve monitoring, land use planning, priority setting and decision making for forest and biodiversity management in the Basin. The specific objectives are to (i) establish an inventory of the Basin's natural resources; (ii) provide biodiversity, deforestation and sustainable development indicators and models of evolution for the various biotops, (iii) localize and measure the deforestation activities and impact; (iv) provide this information to the decision makers, field operators and World community in a reasonable time period and appropriate format; and (v) provide guidelines for pertinent actions.

In order to fulfill the above mentioned objectives, the project would include the following capacity building and investment components:

(a) Capacity building.

The component includes the (i) creation and/or strengthening of a regional and national environmental information primary network; (ii) enhancement of national capacities to manage and use information technologies for environmental monitoring; (iii) specific products to fulfill the information demand of the decision makers and facilitate planning and monitoring activities; and (iv) development of the private sector's capacities for the provision of environmental information.

(b) Investments

This component includes (i) acquisition and distribution of an updated comprehensive coverage of satellite images; (ii) production and distribution of space maps; and (iii) transfer of sustainable technology to the national agencies, NGOs and private sector.

2. GEF Thematic Area: Biodiversity

3. Expected Global Benefits: The REIMP would have the following regional and global benefits: (i) Facilitate more effective global Congo Basin biome conservation and monitoring; (ii) ensure compatibility and integration of the various national information systems and outputs; (iii) provide better information on important cross-border conservation issues such as migration, transhumance, and poaching; and (iv) achieve economies of scale on the investments, production costs and technical preparation expenses of providing this information through a coordinate regional approach.

4. Description of PDF Activities by component for GEF-funded projects. The grant would be used to organize a meeting in Yaounde with all the regional stakeholders to help prepare the project. The tentative program and participants of the meeting are attached to this document. The 3 day meeting will include one day of presentations to describe the regional context in the biodiversity, forestry and information sectors, and two days of sub-group working sessions to design the project and address several technical and institutional issues.

5. Expected outputs and Completion date. The meeting is supposed to be a key phase for addressing institutional and technical issues. It will be held in Yaounde on February 5-7, 1996. The following results are expected:

agreement among the stakeholders: (i) for the arrangements and time schedule for preparation; (ii) the objective of regional coordination units (see PID); and (iii) definition of the products. These will be summarized in a report of the meeting's conclusion and agreements.

6. Other contributors and national level support: The meeting will be co-financed by bilateral donors such as French FAC, USAID, GTZ and Belgium AGCD. The project itself is in the preparatory phase and several donors such as France IFM, Canada, US, Belgium, GTZ and others have expressed an interest for the REIMP. However, the general meeting will be an occasion to establish more specifically the willingness of the other donors to participate. The main counterpart in Cameroon is the Ministère de l'Environnement et des Forêts. The Government counterpart is contributing towards the REIMP.
