Dear Mr. Glemarec,

I would like to inform you that the preparation of the project document for the Integration of Climate Change Risks and Resilience into Forestry Management in Samoa (ICCRIFS) project is in a very advanced stage. A series of stakeholder meetings took place with detailed discussions on project deliverables and suitable demo areas. Regional partners have been engaged (such as SPC, Conservation International, regional office of FAO), and we have also managed to identify suitable co-financing sources through the JICA Forest Conservation Project and the AusAid Agroforestry Project.

Notwithstanding the above, for the effective finalization of the necessary project documents we would need more time, in order to complete the community consultations and the final details on how to best align with the co-financing projects.

Community work in Samoa is rather complex, given the traditional community governance and customary land ownership structure, requiring various rounds of in-depth consultations and consensus building. Following initial community workshops and meetings, the project team sees the need to complete consultations in Laulii-Falefa lowland and upland community area, as well as in communities surrounding Lake Lanoto'o National Park and Mauga o Salafai National Park, which have been selected as demonstration sites.

The AusAID Samoa Agroforestry Project (SAP), Project Design Document (PDD) is currently being re-developed whereas the JICA Forest Conservation Project is on hold for final justification of activities and budget with the involvement of consultants sourced through the donors. This will allow an effective alignment of project objectives and deliverables with the proposed ICCRIFS GEF-LDCF project.

Considering the above, I would like to request an extension of the PPG phase of the ICCRIFS project until December 2010.

Dear Mr. Glemarec:

After reviewing the Project Identification Form (the "PIF") submitted for Samoa: Integration of Climate Change Risk and Resilience into Forestry Management (ICCRIFS), I am pleased to clear the PIF for an indicative amount of \$2,400,000 for possible inclusion in the next work program for review by the LDCF/SCCF Council.

PIF clearance authorizes you to begin preparation of the project proposal taking into account the attached comments made by the GEF Secretariat, which are based on the project concept's eligibility under the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) and which ensures conformity with LDCF strategies.

I am also approving your request for \$50,000 as a PPG for the FSP proposal to be funded under the LDCF, as well as the Agency fee of \$5,000 for project cycle management services associated with the PPG.

This approval is based on the following understandings and milestones:

- (i) During preparation of the full-sized project proposal, the comments of the LDCF/SCCF Council, the GEF Secretariat, the GEF Agencies and the relevant Convention Secretariat(s), will be taken into account;
- (ii) A final full-sized project document will be submitted for CEO endorsement no later than September 2010; and
- (iii) A report on the use of the PPG will be submitted to the Secretariat when submitting the final project document for CEO endorsement.

If any of these understandings or milestones is not or will not be achieved, you are requested to inform me as early as possible, so that I may consult with the beneficiary country and your Agency. Thereafter, I may agree to revised milestones or take a decision to cancel the project proposal and to recommend to the Agency that the associated project preparation grant be cancelled.

All PIFs cleared for inclusion in the work program will be posted on the website for four weeks prior to Council meeting. Should Council Members raise significant policy or strategic concerns about the concept, the Secretariat will undertake consultations with the beneficiary country and your Agency about revisions to address the Council Members' concerns or whether to cancel the project proposal and to recommend that the associated PPG be cancelled.
