Project Title: Removal of Barriers to the Effective Implementation of Ballast Water Control and Management Measures in Developing Countries

We have recently been informed by the State Department of Merchant Marine and Inland Water Transport about the activities under above mentioned project.

It has been demonstrated that the transfer of unwanted organisms through ballast water threatens native populations, fishing and tourism industries, aquaculture and public health. The information received from the relevant officials showed that concrete steps towards minimization of the effects of ballast water transfers are being currently made in Ukraine. The growing interest of the international community and the on going work of the International Maritime Organization (IMO) aiming at introduction of a new annex—to MARPOL 73/78 Convention have been particularly underlined during—the discussion with—IMO—consultant—in Ukraine.

Please refer to the correspondence resting with you vide D.O. No. 7/16/98 PRIVITI.

The proposal entitled "Removal of Barriers to the Effective Implementation of Ballist Water Control and Management Measures in Developing Countries" submitted by the International Maritime Organisation has been examined in this Ministry and we have the following comments to offer:

- 1. The flaw with the proposal is that it is region-based. Considering the nature of the project, it should have been based on ocean bodies and the tropical nature of the countries.
- 2. No baseline biological data is available with regard to the Indian coastal waters/ harbours/ ports. Necessary infrastructure for assessing the impact of ballast water assessment for the Indian waters, therefore, is necessary.
- 3. An alien species namely Mytilopsis Sallei has been identified in the coastal waters of Vishakhapatnam and Mumbai. Its growth and effect on the coastal ecology should be studied carefully.
- 4. Management options for exchange of ballast waters in mid-ocean should be examined.
- 5. Ministry of Environment and Forests should be represented on the Project Steering Committee.
- 6. As fin and shell fish is the first line of attack from alien pathogens, Deptt. of Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture should also be represented in the Steering Committee.

We have not received the comments of the Ministry of External Affairs despite several reminders. The proposal is, however, endorsed by MoEF, subject to the foregoing comments.
