			based fisheries management as a main goal for the Strategic Action Programme (SAP). Pragmatically, they set the design and implementation of coordinated conservation and management fisheries measures as a long-term action. The present project was designed to build on mutual interests, mainly to work together common methods and procedures for stock assessment and to initiate a process of collaborative joint stock assessment. To reach agreement on methods and procedures for joint stock assessment will be a major effort since it is clear that both countries have different views about the methods they currently use. The main endeavour will be to foster dialogue, collaboration and trust. During project preparation, the countries agreed to share and exchange information (as they currently do, based on the 1992 IMARPE - IFOP agreement that will be updated during project implementation) but not to have common databases. The present project can contribute to develop enabling conditions (mainly trust and working mechanisms for positive collaboration among parties) that will facilitate common action to manage the stock.
