By following I am pleased to approve the project proposal for participation of Russian Federation in GEF Peatlands and Climate change project, as the representation of the operations of the Focal Point for GEF projects in Russian Federation.

The project under consideration addressed to the problem of peatlands wise use and management approaches, what would prevent their degradation and therefore greenhouse gases release to the atmosphere.
