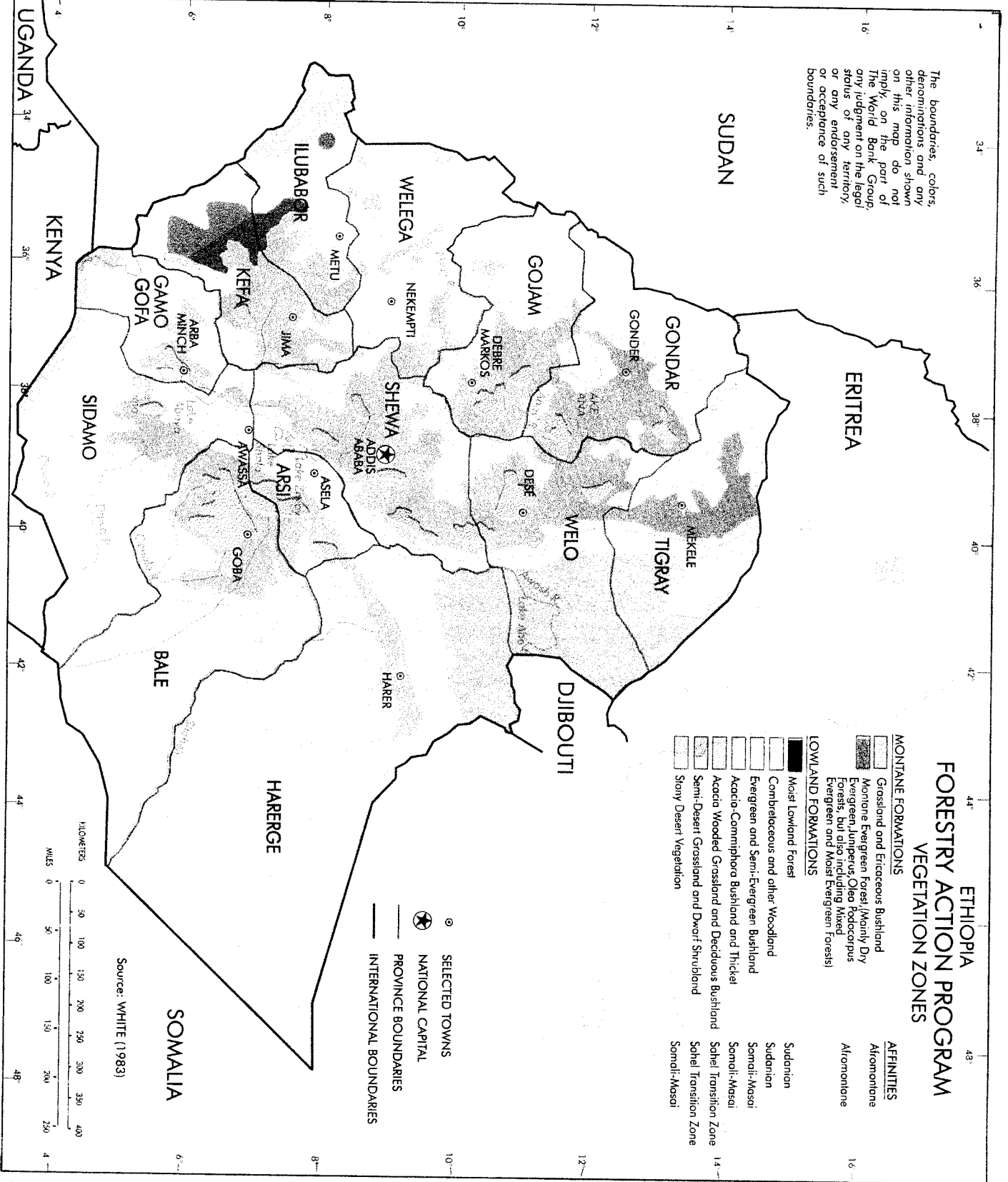

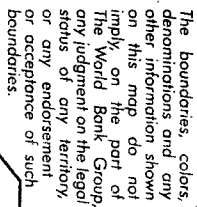

The Environmental Protection Authority has, therefore, endorsed this project and the Ministry of Economic Development and Co-operation has approved it.

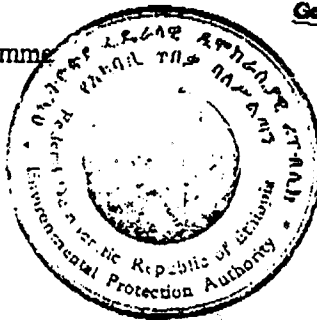
I hope that GEF will be able to fund it.
